Oversee the production of the Integrated Care Strategy

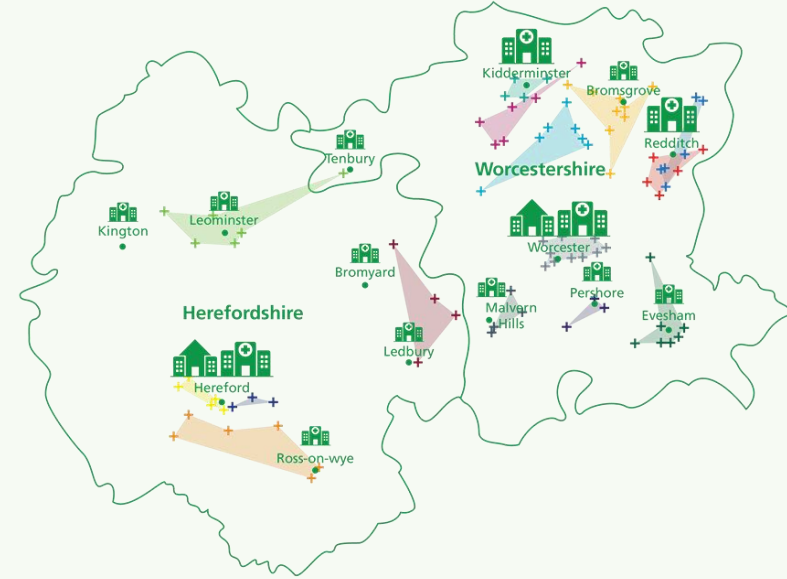
Listening to your views...

Finalising the Integrated care strategy

During February and March the strategy will be refined based on phase 3 engagement feedback, alongside the development of the Joint local health and wellbeing strategy actions plans, measurable indicators and the 5 year joint forward plan. The final version will be presented to the ICPA meeting on the 26th of April.
